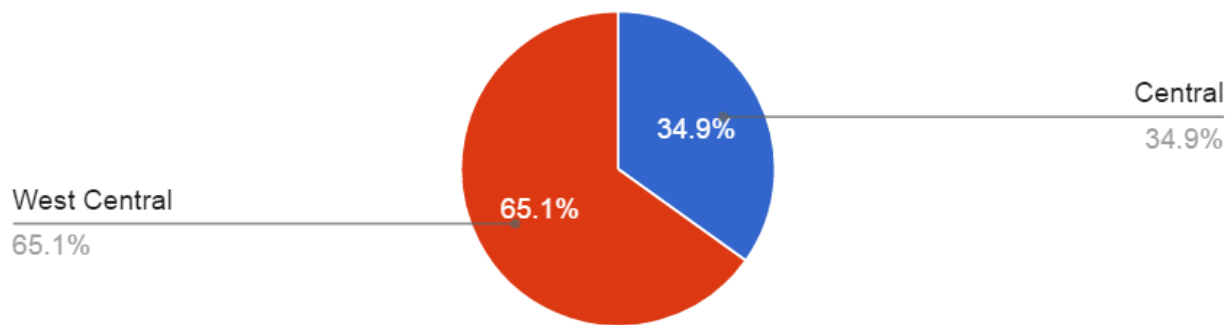

Quarter Highlights:

- Staff conducted an archaeology tour and training for some modern day "Monuments Men" this quarter at Emerson Point (Manatee Co.) about the importance of archaeological sites. As part of their training members of Delta Company, 436th Civil Affairs Battalion, US Army Reserve learn how to identify and mitigate damage to archaeological sites in war zones so that those sites are preserved. We talked a little about the archaeological resources at Emerson Point Preserve, how we identify sites as archaeologists, as well as common threats that damage sites.
- Staff cleaned up from damage left behind by Hurricane Hermine at the beginning of this quarter. The offices in Crystal River received just enough flooding to ruin the carpet. It was subsequently stripped out. The storm gave us another reason to muck out the shed as well. Another effect of Hermine, coastal sites suffered various amounts of damage and change.
